
TREMFYA® (guselkumab) How Do I Use TREMFYA 100 mg/mL Prefilled Syringe?

Important¹

TREMFYA comes as a single-use, single-dose 100 mg/mL prefilled syringe to be injected under the skin. The first self-injection by a patient or caregiver should be performed under the supervision and guidance of a qualified healthcare professional for proper training in subcutaneous injection technique. Following this training, with the approval of a healthcare provider, self-injection at home may be allowed. The TREMFYA Medication Guide and Instructions for Use (IFU) should be reviewed before using the prefilled syringe and prior to each refill.

Storage Information¹

- Store in refrigerator at 36°-46°F (2°-8°C)
- Do not freeze or shake
- Keep out of reach of children
- Keep in original carton to protect from light and physical damage

Gather the Following Supplies1

Prepare¹





1 alcohol



1 cotton ball or gauze pad



1 adhesive bandage



1 sharps container

Not included in the TREMFYA prefilled syringe packaging

Inspect carton

- Keep prefilled syringe in carton, and let it sit on a flat surface at room temperature for at least 30 minutes before use
- Do not warm any other way

 Do not use if expiration date has passed or if carton perforations are broken

Choose injection site

· Injection sites include:



 Front of thighs (recommended)
 Lower stomach area, except for 2-inches around belly-button

- Back of upper arms (only if someone else is injecting)
- Do not inject into tender, bruised, red, hard, thick, scaly, or psoriasis affected skin

Clean injection site

- Wash your hands with soap and warm water
- Wipe chosen injection site with alcohol swab and allow it to dry
- Do not touch,fan, or blow on injection site

Inspect liquid through viewing window

- The liquid should be clear to slightly yellow and may have tiny white or clear particles, or air bubbles
- inject if liquid is cloudy or discolored, or has large particles

Inject1

Remove needle cover

- Hold prefilled syringe by the body and pull needle cover straight off
 - It is normal to see a drop of liquid
- Inject within 5 minutes of removing needle cover
- Do not put needle cover back on
- Do not touch needle or let it touch any other surface
- If dropped, prefilled syringe should not be used

Position fingers and insert needle

- Place thumb, index finger, and middle finger directly under finger flange
- Do not touch plunger or area above finger flange



- Use your other hand to pinch enough skin to inject under skin and not into the muscle
- Insert needle with a quick, dartlike motion at about a 45° angle to the skin

Release pinch and reposition hand



 Use your free hand to grasp the body of the prefilled syringe

Press plunger



 Place thumb from opposite hand on plunger and press it all the way down until it stops

Release pressure from plunger



 Safety guard will cover needle and lock into place, removing needle from your skin



After Injection¹

Dispose of syringe

- Dispose in an FDA-cleared sharps disposal container right away
- Do not throw prefilled syringe in household trash or recycle the used sharps disposal container



Check injection site

- Hold pressure over injection site with a cotton ball or gauze pad until any bleeding stops
- Do not rub the injection site
- If needed, bandage the injection site or liquid may be seen

Disposal of Prefilled Syringe¹

- If you do not have an FDA-cleared sharps disposal container, you may use a household container that is:
 - o made of a heavy-duty plastic
 - o can be closed with a tight-fitting, puncture-resistant lid, without sharps being able to come out
- o upright and stable during use
- o leak-resistant
- o properly labeled to warn of hazardous waste inside the container
- · When the sharps disposal container is almost full, follow the community guidelines for the right way to dispose of the container. There may be state or local laws about how you should throw away used needles and syringes
